## DOUBLE DAWGS AGED/MAEE

The Double Dawgs program was created to give ambitious and motivated students a competitive advantage in today's knowledge economy. By earning both a bachelor's degree and a master's degree in five years or less, students can save time and money while positioning themselves for success after graduation. ALEC offers a Double Dawg program in Agricultural Education BSA/Agricultural and Environmental Education MAEE (non-thesis option). BSA Agricultural Education students must complete the **Double Dawgs Dual Degree Program Pathway Application** during the spring semester of their 3rd (Junior) year. If accepted, this will qualify them to enroll in graduate level (6000) courses the fall semester of their 4th (senior) year prior to student teaching in the spring. Please note, acceptance into the Double Dawgs Dual Degree Program Pathway program does not guarantee admittance into the MAEE program. Students must apply to the MAEE through the graduate college website and meet all requirements for entry into the MAEE program. Please note the following requirements for admission through the Graduate School: After a student has completed a minimum of 60 hours in the AGED BSA program, they can apply to the double dawg degree (AGED/MAEE) program. However, this should be no later than the spring semester of their junior year. Admission requirements include: 1) a minimum GRE score of 140 Quantitative and 150 Verbal or a minimum MAT score of 400, 2) a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, and 3) the successful completion the following courses:

- MATH 1113 Pre-calculus
- CHEM 1211 and CHEM 1211L Freshman Chemistry I and Laboratory I
- BIOL 1107 and BIOL 1107L Principles of Biology I and Laboratory I

IMPORTANT NOTE: Complete PATHWAY applications must include 1) Pathway application, 2) letter from faculty mentor who has agreed to serve as the double dawg student's advisor/chair for the MAEE degree, and 3) unofficial transcripts.
